- The Dallas County Foundation and the Grow Greene County Gaming Corporation teamed up to award our community \$18,200.

- Our Parks and Recreation Committee prepared the grant application.
- Final details on the building's location are still in progress, but we plan to finish construction within 12 months.

Library of Tomorrow

- The Library of Tomorrow committee met on July 19, 2016 at the Roy R. Estle Memorial Library for a final review of the criteria comparison of the sites under consideration for a new library.
- The committee shared information concerning legalities of utilizing the various city owned sites, survey information from lowa librarians whose libraries are in or adjacent to city park areas, and information on the next steps in the process of site selection.
- After an opportunity for final comments on the criteria scoring for the sites under consideration, a motion was made to send the top two sites to the library board which will then send them to the architectural firm for further study and design analysis. The motion was unanimously adopted. Those sites are the Mound Park site and the former lumberyard site. Neither site has been designated as THE site for a new library at this point.
- After the architectural firm does their work, the library board, and ultimately the city council will examine both sites and determine the final site.
- The committee wishes to thank the community for their input and support throughout this process as we all work together to achieve our goal of a beautiful new facility for library patrons of all ages to enjoy.

- ▶ Diabetes Self-Management Education classes Telligen, the Medicare Quality Improvement Organization for Iowa, is working to help reduce the complications associated with diabetes in the Dallas Center area. According to the Center for Disease Control and Prevention, nearly 10 percent of the U.S. population is estimated to have diagnosed or undiagnosed diabetes. Additionally, diabetes was the country's seventh leading cause of death in 2013. Telligen has partnered with Dallas County Public Health and the City of Dallas Center to provide eligible Medicare patients in the community with diabetes self-management education (DSME) classes. The classes are offered at no cost and will cover topics such as medication, nutrition, and foot and eye care. Each class is 1.5 hours long and will be held once a week for 6 weeks. Classes are scheduled at the Raccoon Valley Bank on Wednesdays, August 10 through September 14 from 10:00-11:30 am. If interested in signing up, call Amy at 515-440-8232.
