- The City has contracted with Ed Leedom effective January 1, 2015
- Ed has worked in code enforcement for 17 years and finds that code enforcement is essential to a safe, healthy and growing community.
- The idea of code enforcement is to deter properties from being unsightly to neighbors, to keeping the community safe from objects that may cause danger to people (i.e. children especially). To help property owners maintain their homes, vehicles and yards in a clean, safe manner, and in accordance with city ordinances.
- It is surprising how many items outside can become harborage for pests, rodents, mosquitos...How many items may be fire hazards...How many items can be dangerous for children to play around...And how litter, debris, inoperable and illegally parked vehicles can lower property values.
- Ed hopes to work with the residents and council of Dallas Center to help eliminate these types of public nuisances. To help make Dallas Center a cleaner, healthier and safer place to live.

- Are You Due? The CDC recommends the Tdap vaccine for all adults who have never received the vaccine. Tdap is a combination vaccine that protects against three potentially life-threatening bacterial diseases: tetanus, diphtheria, and pertussis (whooping cough). Tdap can be given any time of the year and only one shot is needed. Please call Dallas County Public Health Nursing Services at 993-3750 or 465-2483 if you are due for a Tdap vaccine. We can bill most insurances.
