#### Winter Reminders ~

- ◆ Snow Parking Ban It is unlawful to park, abandon, or leave unattended any vehicle on any public street, alley or city-owned off street parking area during any snow removal period. The ban shall continue from the beginning of the snowfall to 24 hours after the snowfall has ceased. To help our operators perform their plowing duties in a safe and efficient manner, we ask that residents park elsewhere when the snow begins to accumulate.
- Sidewalks Snow and ice removal from sidewalks is the responsibility of the property owner. Residents are required by ordinance to clear sidewalks within 24 hours of the end of a storm. Please pile the snow on your yard, not in the street. If your sidewalk is icy, you may correct the hazard by applying a heavy coat of sand or de-icer. A helpful hint for residents clear your sidewalk after the snowplows have cleared to the curb.
- ♦ **Fire Hydrants -** The Fire Department requests property owners who have a hydrant on their parking area to clear the snow away for easier access in case of fire.

#### Pet Licenses are required ANNUALLY in January

- → **Purpose** for identification if pet is lost, to prevent pets from being destroyed as stray, and as a way of tracking vicious animals.
- → **Registration** every dog or cat shall be registered with the City prior to January 1<sup>st</sup> of each year.
- → Application Requirements provide proof of current vaccination against rabies, state breed, sex, age, color and name of dog or cat, and address, telephone, and signature of owner.
- → Registration Fees license fee is \$5.00. If the animal is not spayed or neutered, the fee is \$20.00 each. A \$5.00 late fee will be imposed on each dog or cat not registered by February 1st of each year.
- → Impoundment registered animals found at large are subject to a municipal infraction of \$100.00-1st offense, \$200.00-2nd offense, \$400.00-3rd offense, \$625.00-4th offense Unregistered animals or registered animals found at large on more than three (3) occasions shall be seized and impounded. Impounding costs are \$200.00.
- → Tags will not be mailed unless a pre-stamped envelope is included with the application.
