The **Library of Tomorrow Committee** met at the Roy R. Estle Library on Tuesday, May 17th at 7:00 PM. No public comments were heard, so the committee began by reviewing communications to the committee, with members giving input and comment. Clarification was made that no public funds will be used to build the library. The committee heard information concerning ongoing discussions with several property owners. Information was also shared on desirability of a one or two story library building, estimated size needed for outdoor programming space, and an estimate of future expansion space. The committee then reviewed the four main criteria for site selection, and created a second tier of criteria to add for additional consideration. The committee members will be looking at each potential site and rating each site with an evaluation scale on each of the criteria. This will lead to the determination of the best 2-3 sites to be recommended to the library board of trustees. The information gathering and criteria rating process and discussion continue.

The Roy R. Estle Memorial Library Board of Trustees is excited to see that community members are inquiring about how to join our Library of Tomorrow Committee. At this time we would like add an additional member to the committee. The requirements are fairly simple, be a current library patron, have an interest in community projects and be willing to contribute positively to paving a path for our new library no matter the location determined by committee. Please submit a letter of interest and a brief summary of knowledge, skills and abilities that would help those evaluating committee members. Please submit information to the Roy R. Estle Memorial Library by 5:00 PM June 15, 2016.
