Utility "Fun" Facts

Do you ask yourself, "why is my bill so high?" Start tracking your water consumption! Since prices have not changed, consumption is the only thing that can affect your bill.

- 1. The current minimum monthly utility bill is \$72.55. Each household is charged for 3000 gallons of water and sewer each month. If you use 3000 gallons or less, your bill will be \$72.55. If you use more than 3000 gallons your bill will be higher.
- On average, a person uses approximately 1000 gallons of water per month (this can vary slightly depending on if you are a high or conservative user). So, a family of 6 should use approximately 6000 gallons of water.
- 3. In the summer months, consumption is usually higher due to watering the lawn and/or a garden, filling a pool or letting the kids run through the sprinkler and other such summer time activities.
- 4. During other times or when you have no other explanation as to why your consumption is high you probably have a leak. The most common cause of high consumption is toilets. Because you can't see how much water actually runs through a toilet most people think it can't be that much when in fact it is. The next culprits, although not as common as a toilet, are water heaters, water softeners, outside spigots and dishwashers.
- 5. To help put it in perspective, a stream of water measuring 1/16" in diameter can add approximately 25,000 gallons of water to your monthly consumption. That translates to a very high monthly bill.

Code Enforcement Reminders~

- With summer quickly approaching, I wanted to give you some reminders to help keep Dallas Center a place we can all be proud of.
- Mosquitoes-anything that will hold water is an invitation for a disease carrying mosquito. It only takes a hand full of water for a mosquito to lay eggs, so please don't leave open containers in the yard. Mosquitos lay their eggs in clumps called rafts, of 50 to 100 and they usually hatch in just a couple of days. It only takes a little water and an average temperature of 70 degrees for this to take place.
- Grass and Weeds Please be a courteous citizen and neighbor and keep your lawn mowed.
- Also when mowing, please do not blow your grass in the streets. During a rain storm the clippings flow with the water and clog storm drainage grates and that could lead to flooding and damages to your property and your neighbor's property.
- ◆ Tall grass and weeds are not only unsightly they give cover for those bothersome and disease carrying mosquitoes.
