Mayor's Message ~

At the February 14th City Council meeting, the City Council approved contracting with the Dallas County Sheriff's Office for Dallas Center's Law Enforcement. The Safety Committee's next steps will be to negotiate the terms of the contract. Dallas Center would like to have two full time deputies dedicated to our community. We would like one Deputy assigned to the day shift and one in the evenings and weekends. This would be very similar coverage as we have today. The Safety Committee would like to have a final contract for the March 14th City Council meeting. Chief Leonard will retire in early April and we wish her well in retirement.

Library of Tomorrow Committee~

The Library of Tomorrow committee met at 6:00 pm on Tuesday, February 21st at Memorial Hall. The OPN architects presented their final design drafts to the committee and others present in the audience. A time of public comment was held, after which the committee held their session with the architects. Committee members suggested a few minor changes to the designs, which the architects will work with before the committee's next meeting. Both site designs are exciting and would be assets to our community. The Library of Tomorrow committee will meet at Memorial Hall again on Tuesday, March 21st at 7:00 pm to discuss and finalize their recommendation to the library board on the site designs. Wanted: Garden Land

- FREE TREES. The City of Dallas Center is partnering with the Brenton Arboretum and the Iowa Department of Natural Resources to provide tree seedlings to Dallas Center residents at no cost.
- The trees will be available for pickup at the Brenton Arboretum on Saturday, April 29th between 9:00 am-noon on a first come first serve basis.
- The arboretum will also offer a brief planting demonstration at the top of each hour and answer any questions you may have about how to care for your new trees.
- The varieties available are: Northern Pecan, Shagbark Hickory, Swamp White Oak and White Oak, all suitable for residential plantings given adequate space. These seedlings are 1 to 2 feet high, so they are easy to plant.
- In time they will grow into large storm resistant shade trees that will add beauty to your yard and our town for many years to come.
