UTILITY BILL - AVAILABLE PAYMENT OPTIONS

- PROCESSING IS FREE You can pay your utility bill using ACH, which is an automatic transfer from your bank to ours. The form is on our website at: <u>www.dallascenter.com</u>. Click on Forms, View All, Automatic Bill Pay Sign Up. The amount is pulled on the 15th of the month and there are no processing fees. *This ensures you'll pay on time and will not be charged any late penalty fees.*
- YOUR BANK'S ONLINE BILL PAY If you pay your bills through your bank, please allow <u>10-12 business days</u> for the check to reach us through the mail. If your payment does not reach us by the 15th, you will be assessed a penalty.
- ONLINE CREDIT CARD PAYMENT Payment for utility services only can be made at <u>www.dallascenter.com</u> through AllPaid. Click on the "Online Payments" tab located on the home page. There is a processing fee of 2.95% with a minimum of \$1.00 that will be added to your payment.
- CHECKS OR CASH may be placed in the secured drop box on the front door of City Hall. Checks may be mailed to City of Dallas Center, PO Box 396, Dallas Center, IA 50063. However, if your payment does not reach us by the 15th, you will be charged a late penalty fee.

- Summer Public Works Assistants: Approximately 15-20 hrs./wk. Minimum age of 18 years old and have a valid driver's license. Applications due March 1st.

- Summer Pool Admissions: Full time and Part time positions available. Duties include front window coverage and phone duty at the pool. Minimum age of 15 years old. Applications due March 31st.

Do you know who CIRHA is?

- Central Iowa Regional Housing Authority (CIRHA) is a Housing Authority that helps low-income families with rental assistance in Boone, Dallas, Jasper, Madison, Marion and Story counties.
- Families pay 30% of their gross adjusted income for the rent and the Housing Authority pays the difference directly to the landlord on the first of each month.

Winter Reminders

- Snow Parking Ban It is unlawful to park, abandon, or leave unattended any vehicle on any public street, alley, or city-owned off-street parking area during any snow removal period. The ban shall continue from the beginning of the snowfall to 24 hours after the snowfall has ceased.
- Sidewalks Snow and ice removal from sidewalks is the responsibility of the property owner. Residents are required by ordinance to clear sidewalks within 24 hours of the end of a storm.
- Fire Hydrants The Fire Department requests property owners who have a hydrant on their parking area to clear the snow away for easier access in case of fire.
