Utility Payments~

- Bill Pay Reminder for those of you that use your bank's online bill pay for paying your water bill, please allow **7-10 business days** for the check to reach us through mail. So, if you pay online a couple of days before the 15th of the month, but we don't receive it until after the 15th, you will be assessed a penalty.

- The City Council will approve tax abatement applications at their February meeting. If your new home qualifies, please turn your application in to City Hall before February 3rd.
- The City would like to remind all homeowners of the importance of having your **house numbers clearly visible** on your house, in case you ever have an emergency.

City Audits:

- The State Auditor's Office conducted an annual examination of the City's records and this information has been released

- The City of Dallas Center prides ourselves on the controls we have in place to handle and protect the public's funds. We choose to hire the lowa State Auditor's office for a thorough examination and audit. We also elected to continue to have a full audit every four years (in addition to the required annual examination) which exceeds the state audit and examination requirements.
- Due to the fact that we are a small office, we have implemented internal controls to safeguard public funds. Some of those safeguards include invoice review by two different council members each month, dual check signature, bank statement reconciliation review by a council member, general ledger posting review by another council member, mayor's sign off of timesheets and payroll, to name a few.

Reminder to all pet owners: when walking your pet through our community or in one of our beautiful parks you need to clean up after it. We have Doggie Waste Stations in Memorial and Mound Parks equipped with waste bags for your convenience. Thank you to those that already pick up after your dogs. It's very much appreciated.

Winter Reminders ~

- Snow Parking Ban It is unlawful to park, abandon, or leave unattended any vehicle on any public street, alley or city-owned off-street parking area during any snow removal period. The ban shall continue from the beginning of the snowfall to 24 hours after the snowfall has ceased. To help our operators perform their plowing duties in a safe and efficient manner, we ask that residents park elsewhere when the snow begins to accumulate.
- Sidewalks Snow and ice removal from sidewalks is the responsibility of the property owner. Residents are required by ordinance to clear sidewalks within 24 hours of the end of a storm. Please pile the snow on your yard, not in the street. If your sidewalk is icy, you may correct the hazard by applying a heavy coat of sand or de-icer. A helpful hint for residents-clear your sidewalk after the snowplows have cleared to the curb.
- Fire Hydrants The Fire Department requests property owners who have a hydrant on their parking area to clear the snow away for easier access in case of fire
