Mayor's Message - June 2020

Hello all! Spring and Summer bring busy times for the City, even in the COVID-19 Emergency, here are a few highlights:

★ Garbage Pick-Up

- Hatton street storm water extension from Walnut to Ash is just about complete, this will help with storm water removal in a multiple block area.
- Multiple street resurfacing projects for Laurel, Ash, Sycamore and 9th are scheduled for this summer.
- Sewer treatment plant upgrade continues.
- Park improvements continue: the Burnett Complex dugouts have been reroofed, bathrooms in the park are being refreshed, painting, pool cleaning (we are still planning to open this summer), and many more.
- Don't forget you can access the full budget information on the City's website. The levy rate will stay the same at \$12.68 for 20-21, which will provide \$1,153,619 in property tax revenue.
- The Library will be going ahead with renovations, the bids came in significantly under estimate.

Don't forget to obtain your <u>building permit</u> before you start! Permits are required for additions, sheds, decks, sidewalks, drive-ways, fences, egress windows, remodeling, electrical upgrades, etc. – just about anything that requires tools and sweat!

Be sure to allow approximately five days for processing the permit. If you have any questions as to whether or not you need a building permit, call City Hall at 992-3725.

Code Enforcement Reminders

- Please pick up after your pets!!!
- With summer quickly approaching, I wanted to give you some reminders to help keep Dallas Center a place we can all be proud of.
- Grass, weeds or brush shall be cut, mowed and maintained so as not to exceed the following height specifications:
 - 1. Developed Residential Areas not to exceed eight inches (8").
 - 2. Undeveloped Residential Areas not to exceed ten inches (10").
 - 3. Business and Industrial Areas not to exceed eight inches (8").

Grass, weeds and brush which are allowed to grow in excess of the above specified limitations are deemed to be nuisances and to be violations of this chapter.

- Tall grass and weeds are not only unsightly they give cover for those bothersome and disease carrying mosquitoes.
- Anything that will hold water is an invitation for a mosquito. It only takes a hand full of water for a mosquito to lay eggs, so please don't leave open containers in the yard.
- Let's continue to make Dallas Center a beautiful, safe and healthy place to live and raise a family.
